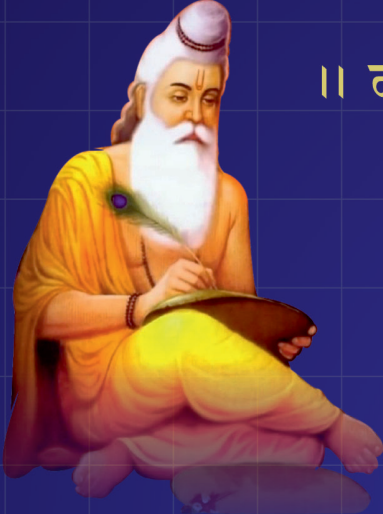


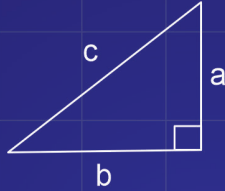

The Institute will devise its own assessment procedure for extension based on the contribution and requirement of the experts engaged as Professors of Practice.
